

Maruja Asis is Director of Research and Publications of the Scalabrini Migration Center (SMC), based in Manila, Philippines. (<http://www.smc.org.ph>).

She is a sociologist who has long been involved in migration studies in Asia, particularly on topics dealing with migration policies, unauthorized or irregular migration, and the relationship between migration on the one hand, and gender, family relations and social change on the other. Recent research projects in which she was principal investigator or co-investigator include: migration, domestic service and the family in Southeast Asia (with Brenda Yeoh and Shirlena Huang, National University of Singapore), the Southeast Asia project on irregular migration and the Philippine country-study (with Graziano Battistella, Scalabrini Migration Center), the Philippine country-study of female labor migration in Southeast Asia, and population mobility and HIV vulnerability in the BIMP-EAGA region. She is currently directing a nationwide study on the impacts of international labor migration on the children and families left behind in the Philippines (to be completed in March 2004). Since 1997, she has served as Associate Editor of the *Asian and Pacific Migration Journal*, a refereed quarterly journal, and Co-editor of the *Asian Migration News*, a bi-weekly online news service. In line with the manifold programs of SMC in the Asia-Pacific, her involvement in migration issues also entails engagement with NGOs and international organizations in promoting the rights of migrants.

Prior to joining SMC, she was Associate Professor at the Department of Sociology, University of the Philippines, where she taught courses in population studies and research methodology.
